#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

TTOA Board welcomed Council Woman Kristin Palmer to the August 2018 Board Meeting. In preparation of the meeting, power-point slides were created showing images of the badly damaged streets in Tall Timbers. Streets such as Pin Oak, Post Oak, Tall Pines, and others. We also brought "Fix Our Streets, We Pay Taxes" signs to the board meeting.

During the meeting, I reminded the councilwoman for over 30 years TTOA's budget included:

- Maintenance and grass cutting service of Collins Park.
- Security service, reducing calls to the Fourth District Police.
- Residents cutting grass at the S&WB pumping station on the corner of Tall Timbers and Tall Pines.

I shared with Council Woman Palmer, TTOA has been a Great Neighbor. We have done our part and now we are demanding that our streets be repaired. We are requesting residents to attend the City Budget Meeting (November) with our "Fix Our Streets" signs- date to be determine. Also, an invitation has been extended to the Mayor to attend our October General Meeting.

As I close this message, I would like to share that one of the most difficult parts of this volunteer position is speaking to what constitutes a good neighbor. We live in a covenant community with guidelines, just as there are city/state laws, ordinances. Most are in place to protect and keep residents safe.

I define a good neighbor as one that adheres to the covenants and citystate ordinances/laws. Doing something as simple as parking your vehicle with the flow of traffic, not parking near fire hydrants- leaving it free should the fire department require use of it; walking your pets on a leash and picking up after them.

Being a good neighbor is also being considerate of your neighbors when hosting parties or having an activity where guests may get a bit loud. Making your neighbor aware of your event, prior to the event, is showing consideration for your neighbor. Paying your TTOA dues for the services you receive, removing vehicles off your property, that are no longer operable, or cutting down weeds or trees for a neighbor who may need assistance. I ask that we all work together to be Good Neighbors and together we can make Tall Timbers a better place to live.

#### **LEGAL ACTIONS ON COLLECTIONS - UPDATE**

In 2017, Tall Timbers filed 42 liens against the property of homeowners that owed two or more annual assessments, and subsequently filed 41 suits against those that failed to pay. The status of those suits are:

Paid in full: 8 (including one who was defaulted)

Now making payments: 7

Proved they had paid: 2

Default judgments taken: 18 (see <u>Judgment debtor rules</u> below)

Judgment after trial: 1 (see <u>Trial</u> below)

Still working on serving: 5
Uncollectable (foreclosed): 1

So far Tall Timbers has collected over \$12,000 for past due assessments and continues to aggressively pursue those yet to bring their balances current.

<u>Trial:</u> On May 25<sup>th</sup> went to trial and won against a homeowner who contested Tall Timbers' right to collect annual assessments. That homeowner claimed not to have been informed at the act of sale assessments would be owed.

Tall Timbers proved the homeowner's act of sale specifically referenced the covenants and the covenants provided for annual assessments. Longtime member and former treasurer Tom Rinard testified about the history of how the annual assessments were raised in the 1980's to \$180 and current treasurer Jay Fielding was prepared to testify about the past due amounts but his testimony was not needed since the homeowner did not contest the amount. President Gilbert Crowden appeared as Tall Timbers' official representative at trial.

The judge ruled in favor of Tall Timbers awarding all of the unpaid annual assessments (\$720) *plus* \$250 for attorney's fees and court costs totaling over \$393 so far. The judge also recommended the homeowner pay what was owed before more fees and costs were incurred if Tall Timbers had to return to court to enforce its judgment.

<u>Judgment debtor rules:</u> Those against whom default judgments were obtained and who have not made arrangements to pay, have been ordered by the court to appear with proof of their assets in June so that Tall Timbers can begin seizing and selling their assets.

<u>Upcoming actions</u>: Those homeowners that have not yet complied with their obligations should do so now because Tall Timbers is about to begin filing liens and suits against those who have not paid their 2017 and 2018 assessments. Failure to do so will mean that instead of owing just \$180 a year for each unpaid assessment, the homeowner will also incur collection costs of at least \$1,153.50.


